Devon that you have a list of places which means you don't have to spend time looking for somewhere when you can be enjoying the countryside and all that South Devon has to offer.

1. The Victoria Inn, Salcombe.

If you are looking for a traditional pub with exposed stone walls and wooden beams with a roaring fire in the Winter then this is the place for you. There is a lovely beer garden for the warm afternoons and evenings. Your dog won't miss out as there is a doggie menu for those hungry hounds. The pub is South of Salcombe Harbour opposite a small car park, which does get busy. The pub is popular so booking is recommended.

2. The Warren Inn, Postbridge, near Yelverton

After a long walk on Dartmoor what better place than to pop into the Warren Inn which is in the heart of the Dartmoor National Park. Another traditional pub with original oak beams and an old fire that they say has been burning since 1845. Dogs are welcome in the bar area. The menu includes their homemade Warren's pie which is a rabbit pie or you may fancy the Steak and Ale pie or even a Dartmoor Beef burger. They have a good choice of Vegetarian options.

3.The Fisherman's Arms, Plymouth

After walking along the Hoe why not end up at Fisherman's Arms, minutes away from the Barbican area of Plymouth. If you like history the pub has part of the old Plymouth Castle's wall in the pub. Plymouth Castle is said to date back to the 14th Century. The pub and it's resident dog will welcome you and your four legged friend.

4.The Old Inn, Widecombe in the Moor, Dartmoor

After climbing Hay Tor on Dartmoor The Old Inn is a short drive from the Tor. Nestled in the heart of this small village with a spectacular view over Hameldown. It has everything you may expect from a Moorland pub from a roaring fire in the winter and a lovely pub garden where chickens and Ducks roam. Enjoy a traditional ploughmans or pastie or a hot cup of soup for lunch.

5.The Sloop Inn, Bantham

A stone's throw away from the beach is this 14th Century pub, nestled in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and close to the South West Coast Path. This area is known for shipwrecks, pirate activity and smuggling and is full of history. They have a very extensive menu with lunchtime snacks and vegetarian options.
